Introduction

- CNAs are key to inform SDG 4.1.1
- Next round of CNAs is approaching quickly:
 - PISA 2018
 - PISA for Development
 - PILNA 2018
 - SEA-PLM 2018/19
 - TIMSS 2019
 - LLECE 2019
 - PASEC 2019
 - PIRLS 2021
 - LANA
 - SACMEQ V





CNA Questionnaire

Questionnaires sent to 210 countries and territories asking

- If they are planning to participate in the next round of CNA
- If their participation is formally confirmed
- If they going to test the SDG4.1.1 target grades and subject areas
- Their financial situation to participate in CNAs
- If they have a permanent institution or unit to implement a CNA
- If they need technical assistance to participate in CNAs

So far, 80/210 (38%) countries have returned their questionnaires

- Highest return rate from high income countries (56%); lowest return rate from low income countries (16%)
- Highest return rates from North America and Western Europe (64%); lowest return rates from Sub-Saharan Africa (21%)



Key findings





Participation in CNAs

 60/80 (75%) countries are participating or planning to participate in the next round of CNAs

22 countries in just one CNA

131 CNA/countries

- 20 countries in 2 CNAs
- 23 countries in 3 CNAs

Participation in CNAs

- Countries are participating or planning to participate in 131 CNAs
- Participation status
 - 89/131 (68%) CNAs have been formally confirmed.
 - 18/131 (14%) Participation is in the process of confirmation.
 - 11/131 (8%) Participation is still under discussion.
 - 13/131 (10%) no response provided (missing)
- 110/131 (84%) cases there is a national institution or unit to implement the CNA.





Participation in CNAs

- For the countries that are NOT participating in CNAs, the main reasons are
 - Lack of financing: Aruba, Armenia, Georgia, Kyrgyz, Sao Tome, Grenada, Namibia
 - Uncertainty about which CNA to join
 - A national assessment will be administered instead





Adequacy to inform SDG 4.1.1

- All 131 cases will measure math or reading
- 120/131 (92%) cases will use a sample that is representative of the entire country
 - Cases where a sub-national sampling will be used
 - Azerbaijan: Baku city will only participate in PISA 2018
 - Georgia: Has not secured funding to test language minority schools in PIRLS 2021; these schools will be excluded from TIMSS 2019.
 - Other cases: Do not know or missing
- 11/131 (8%) cases will test grades 2 or 3
 - LLECE 2019 at grade 3 (7 cases)
 - PASEC 2019 at grade 2 (3 cases)
 - PIRLS 2021 at grade 3 (1 case)
- 35/131 (27%) cases will test at the end of primary education
- 51/131 (39%) cases will test at the end of lower secondary education.





Technical Assistance

- Only 35/131 (27%) cases reported needing technical assistance
 - Data come mainly from high income countries
 - Demand for technical assistance increases among lower income countries
- Areas where countries need technical assistance the most
 - Sampling
 - Administration
 - Data processing and analysis
 - Data reporting, communication, and uses





Costs and financial situations

Costs of participating in a CNA

- Participation fees, overheads: ~USD\$200,000
- In-country implementation: ~USD\$1,500,000
- Total costs: ~USD\$1,700,000

Main sources of funding

- Government: 110/131 (84%) cases
- Local or international donations: 16/131 (12%) cases

Financial situation

- 86/131 (66%) cases full financing is secure
- 28/131 (21%) cases full financing is not secure





Costs and financial situations

• 16/131 (12%) cases (from 10 countries) are looking for financial assistance:

- Albania: PISA 2018, TIMSS 2019
- Burundi: PASEC 2019
- Bosnia and Herzegovina: PISA 2018, TIMSS 2019
- Georgia: PISA 2018, TIMSS 2019, PIRLS 2021
- Honduras: LLECE 2019, PISA-D
- Jordan: PISA 2018
- Latvia: PISA 2018, PIRLS 2021
- Montenegro: PISA 2018, TIMSS 2019
- Namibia: SACMEQ V
- El Salvador: LLECE 2019

Financial assistance will be mainly used to fund

- International participation fees
- Assessment implementation
- Training for the national project team





Conclusions and next steps

- Need to increase participation of countries in CNAs by
 - Identifying reasons for non participation
 - Addressing those reason case by case
 - Securing funding and technical assistance
- Very few countries will have data to inform SDG 4.1.1.
 at grades 2/3
 - Measuring grades 2/3 should be a priority
- Next steps
 - Finalize analyses of CNA questionnaires
 - Add new countries
 - Recompute with a special focus on lower income countries
 - Include data from (a) CNA agencies Questionnaire, and
 (b) Donors Questionnaires.
 - Background paper with final results will be ready in January 2018
